My whanau and I returned to my tūrangawaewae 9 years ago and as a Ngāti Mutunga person, we are proud to be living here on our whenua. We purchased our home overlooking the Urenui awa, and were excited about the opportunity to raise our children on the awa along with the values of kaitiakitanga or environmental guardianship. Unfortunately, the reality is contrast to this, as we cannot swim or eat from the awa.

This awa has been the life line for our people for many generations and it saddens me to think that the mouri of the awa has been affected due to raw human sewage leaking directly into the water. To think that this has been the case for many years is highly disappointing and is a direct breach of The Treaty of Waitangi. This is because it is having a negative effect on taonga species and Te Mana o Te Wai.

Te Mana o Te Wai is about recognising water as being an important resource that has mana. This means, that through that kinship, there is an inherent responsibility to protect it. It is the concept of personifying the awa which recognises the mana of the awa as having rights like that of a person. We do not pour sewage, toxins or pollutants into our grandmother, Papatūānuku, so why would we do it to the awa.

From a Māori perspective, there are a set of common values which denote the way Tangata Whenua connect with the environment. These include whakapapa (genealogy), mana (authority, right, and power), tapu (sacred or controlled), noa (the state of removing tapu), tikanga (practice) and mouri (life force). These values inform how tangata whenua or people of the land, place ourselves in the world, and how we engage with it.

We need to invest money into restoring the mouri of the water and to ensure Te Mana o Te Wai is upheld. I see this as being a collective responsibility, not just the responsibility of the residents, as this is about the wellbeing of the community and those visiting the river.

As a response to the leak of raw sewage, Ngāti Mutunga placed a rāhui (temporary restriction) over the Urenui River. As the person who conducted the karakia to place the

rāhui over the river on behalf of Ngāti Mutunga, aside from our kinship responsibility, this was a social response to protect the health and wellbeing of the community and those visiting.

This as an urgent social matter that needs addressing effective immediately. Once again, I urge the Council to invest in fixing the sewerage issues before they consider any other spending.

The LTP seemed to focus on a couple of big high quality investments rather than stated outcomes and the most cost effective way to maximise KMs available to meet those outcomes (all be it the 2 projects are great).

Disagree with all options - innovation, imagination and action is needed here urgently. It feels like we will be 3+ years in to the Climate Action Framework (having used up 25%+ of the window the IPCC said we had to 2030)m, spent \$\$\$?S and done nothing meaningful. The role of council in tacking the climate challenge is critical, the clock is ticking fast and the work to date and this proposal continue to show a capacity to spend money but not enable the community to make an impact. NPDC/ TRCs investments or lack of changed investments in roading, parking, urban design, building standards, Lets Go, buses, mobility as a service, car share and other digital social infrastructures etc dictate people's choices and action, but no tangible progress is being made beyond Lets Go and active travel! The CAF may be a lovely document but is not driving urgent action (and the very little action proposed will only make things worse). I am told action needs 1. a lot of funding and 2. direction from govt. This inaction and closed mindset makes me and my tamariki angry and feeling helpless. We need open innovative thinking - as other councils are doing. Lets take EVs. I hear we are short of money to act on climate change, But we have \$1m for EVs. If EVs are the answer then as CCC has shown there are ways to get them for no capital spend, lower lifecycle costs, with an optimised fleet that reduces the embedded carbon in new cars (that is a big problem) and that brings a mobility as a service solution to NP to help other cut emissions at no cost. As presented to council staff and councillors before, simply buying EVs does not solve the problem - the embedded carbon in the new cars means we will increase global cumulative CO2 initially (a big problem) and reduce them by the 2040's less than 10% (too little, too late). We need to reduce vKMt another way - as CCC are doing intelligently. This then free up a good chunk of the \$10m for the LTP to get on with investing in other low cost solutions that really help - promoting car sharing whilst making CBD parking far less attractive. We need to also see what the additional \$150k is to be spent on - if it is more staff writing more action frameworks without real carbon reducing actions (or worse ones aggravating the problem), then we are wasting money, opportunity and our tamariki's future. It is hard to see on this pressing issue how our governance body and executive are meeting the new standards on governance responsibilities set out by the Task For For Climate Related Financial Disclosures or their moral obligations for tamariki, papatuanuku and future generations. This section has been written with input for one of my (angry) teenagers!
