

6.4 Clovelly Street Reserve

Description

Location:	Clovelly Street
Legal description:	Part Lot 1 DP 5670
Size:	0.15 hectares
Reserve status:	Reserve



Physical description

This reserve is a flat box shaped piece of land surrounded by residential houses. The main entrance is from the end of the small Clovelly Street cul de sac.

Tangata whenua interests

This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Ngati Te Whiti.

Land status and history

This land was originally held by the crown for the purpose of state housing. In 1953 the land was set apart as reserve for recreation purposes by the Governor General Lieutenant General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie. In the same year the land was vested in the New Plymouth City Council, in trust for recreation purposes.

Existing improvements

The play equipment currently consists of a swing set and seesaw. There is also a park seat at the side of the play ground.

Uses and activities

This reserve provides opportunities for child's play and picnicking.

Classification

Recreation

Management objectives and specific policies

- Management and development of this reserve will ensure open space areas are preserve for casual recreation (i.e. kicking a ball)
- Council officers will work with neighbouring residents to upgrade boundary fencing where required.
- Due to the access leg nature of entrance into the reserve, the design of the fence should be maintained at a low height along this access leg.
