The property was transferred to the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of New Plymouth in 1929 for the purpose of recreation reserve upon subdivision. In 1983 the land was classified as a Local Purpose (site for scout hall) reserve by way of gazette notice.

Existing improvements

A scout hall is located within the reserve which is owned by New Zealand Scouting, who has a lease for the land that the building occupies.


The reserve is predominantly used for scout meetings. The reserve also acts as an entrance to the Westown School playing fields.


