Physical description

This reserve is entirely flat, located on the corner of Jackson and Mouatt Streets.

Tangata whenua interests

This reserve is within the tribal rohe of Te Atiawa Iwi. The area is of historic and cultural significance to Manukorihi, Pukerangiora and Otaraua Hapu.

Land status and history

In 1982 this piece of land was declared recreation reserve subject to the Reserves Act 1977. In the same year it was gazetted that the reserves shall be known as James Nuku Reserve, after a local identity, Jimmy Nuku.

The land behind this reserve is often also considered James Nuku reserve; this area is leased and managed by the Waitara Golf Club.

Existing improvements

A post and rail fence exists on the road frontage of this reserve, which was installed to prevent cars driving on the reserve and causing damage. A shed also exists near the south east corner, which is owned by the fire service and used for the storage of equipment.

Uses and activities


The area is an informal open space which is suitable for casual ball games, children's play and picnicking.
